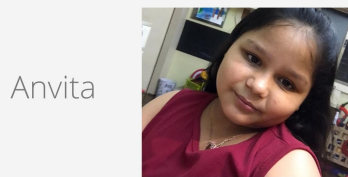

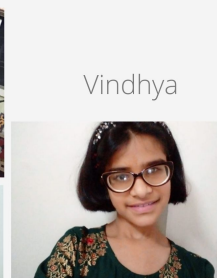
Raksha Bandhan

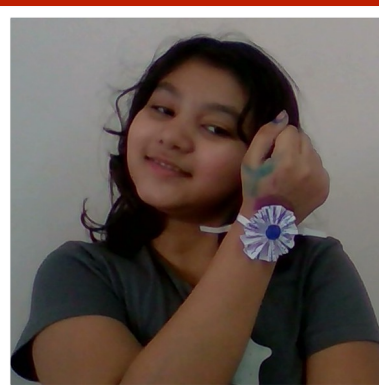

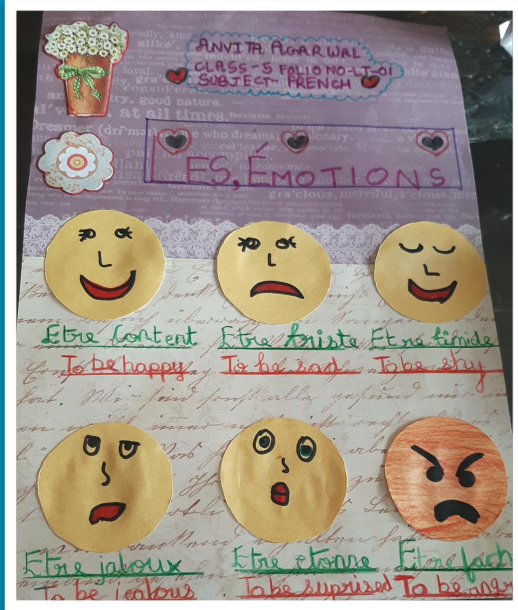
HUMAN HISTORIES

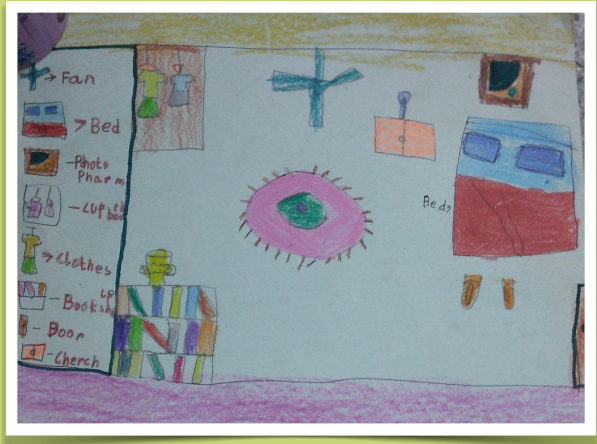

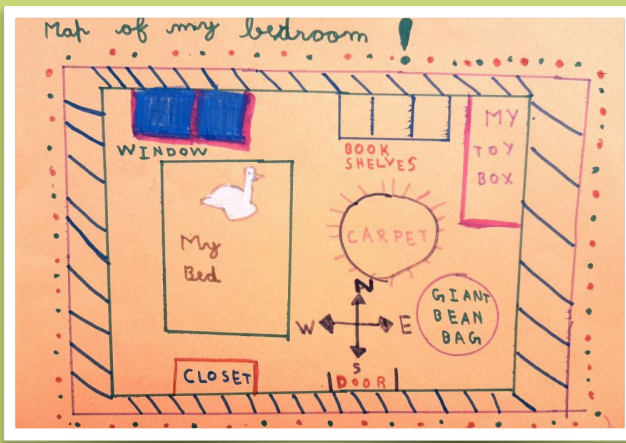

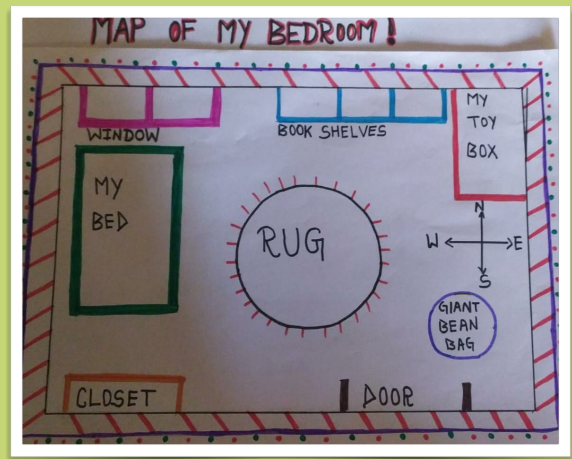
