TALES OF BLANK PAGES

The policy of ‘Divide and Rule’ adopted by Lord George Curzon, once viceroy of India served as a powerful tool in the hands of the British as they exercised supreme control over colonial India. However, the same cannot be said for Pakistan as it attempted to “polarize” the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) on the account of the denial of human rights in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir.

The 42nd regular session of the UNHRC in Geneva witnessed a heated debate as Pakistan’s contradictory statements regarding the basic rights of the people in Jammu and Kashmir received various arguments against the same, majority of which was given by the representatives of the Ministry of External Affairs.

India shot back its answer to Pakistan’s inquiry after the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights Michelle Bachelet proposed for a statement be delivered with respect to the unrest in Kashmir and Assam as she talked about the exclusion of 1.9million nationals from the exercise of NRC. In her speech she said, “I am deeply concerned about the impact of recent actions by the Government of India on the human rights of Kashmiris, including restrictions on internet communications and peaceful assembly, and the detention of local political leaders and activists.” This was preceded by Pakistan’s released statements with respect to the same.

Pakistan’s Foreign Minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi was ridiculed with regard to the baseless allegations he placed through his national statements against India. He asked for the UNHRC to protect and provide “justice and respect” for the people of Jammu and Kashmir. The Indian delegation, in rebate said that the world should put a light on those who misuse global platforms “for malicious political agendas under the garb of Human Rights.” India also appealed to the Council to seek action against terrorists and state sponsors of terrorism. The Pakistani delegation moved forward with various such statements relating to the so called absence of human rights for the people of Kashmir. Its claims were further shadowed as the Indian representatives indirectly hinted at the country saying, “Those who abet, finance, and support terrorism in any form on territory under their control are in truth the worst violators of human rights.” Vimarsh Arya of the Ministry of External Affairs further stated that, “Jammu and Kashmir has been, is and shall continue to be an integral part of India. Pakistan’s nefarious designs will never succeed because the people of India are united in their determination to preserve our territorial integrity along with our core values of democracy, tolerance and unity in diversity.” He extended remarks saying that Pakistan itself has stopped publishing the official numbers of various religious and ethnic groups that are facing elimination inside the country. He stressed on the discrimination and issues faced by the religious minorities and groups in Pakistan saying that the country has forgotten that “Terrorism is the worst form of human rights.” India further assured that the situation in Jammu and Kashmir is under full control as it spoke in the Council about its national devices such as media, civil society and institutional framework that efficiently holds up and supports Human Rights and that it will ensure gender justice, property rights and democratic representation. The Indian delegate further retorted to Pakistan’s

statements by saying, “One delegation has given a running a commentary with offensive rhetoric of false allegations and concocted charges against my country. The world is aware that this fabricated narrative comes from the epicenter of global terrorism, where ring leaders were sheltered for years.”

India further addressed the issue of Assam as mentioned by the High Commissioner giving the statement that the National Register of Citizens (NRC) is a “statutory, transparent and non-discriminatory” process and its outcome will conform to “Indian



Law and will be consistent with India's democratic traditions.”, thus making a strong statement and its point clear.-**Sneha Saha, 12B**

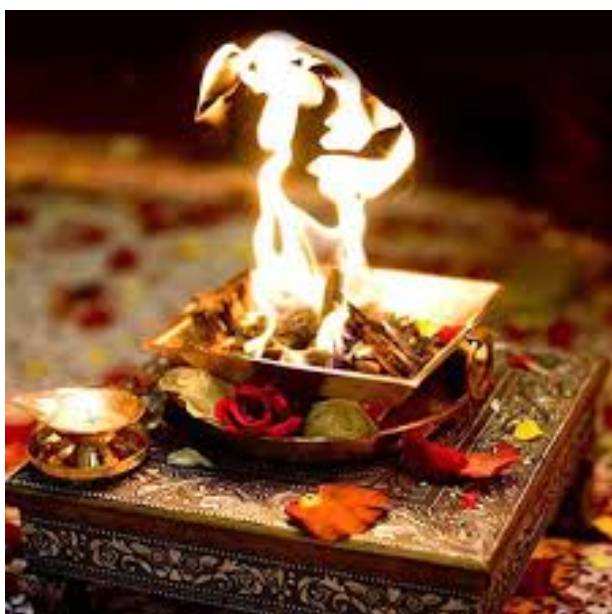
THE WEEKLY HAVAN

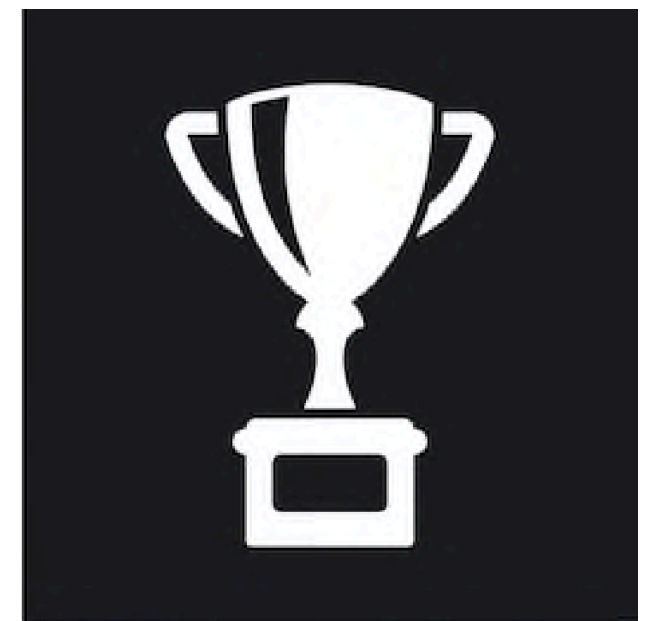
