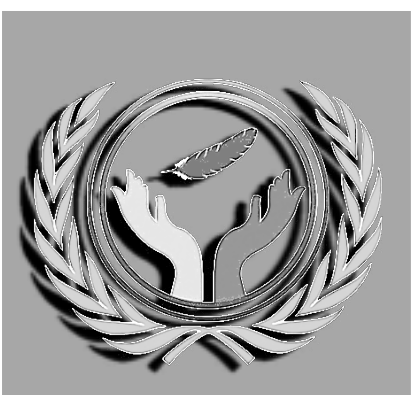

"women need to support women", The USA to the world leaders.

The three-day intense convention of MIS-MUN started its first day on May 22, 2020. The convention commenced with an hour-long opening ceremony followed by two committee sessions. The commission on the status of women also known as CSW undertook the initiative to discuss the effects of female genital mutilation. The first session initiated with a general speaker list which lasted for 20 minutes. The delegates of the USA, Egypt, India, and Australia put forth their countries' views and beliefs. Egypt with full disclosure accepted that the country has been practicing female genital mutilation for a long time but is ready to change in the view of the fact that the country banned the practice recently. The USA takes note that female genital mutilation is done for the purity of girls according to some religions, but the country denies to believe it and has no tolerance for the same.

The USA continues to further raise a moderated caucus on the health effects caused by female genital mutilation. The countries brought on the table the fact that, "there are no health benefits of female genital mutilation." The practice involves the partial or complete removal of the female genital organs which ultimately lead to lifelong complications for the women. The procedure has a great impact on women's physical and mental status. It could also lead to depression; nightmares and could also lead to women forgetting the memory of the procedure being done. When discussing the healthcare Responses that could be provided to the previous victims it was distinguished, that the female undergoing the procedure have 60-70 percent more chance of having c- section than the other women of the same age.

The delegates were observed requesting other delegates to be empathetic in the situation and understand the severity of the problem. The question if the further generations could improve the situation brought the committee to a standstill. While the USA implied that beliefs of few could not be changed, Egypt showed a firm belief that the further generations will stand against the cause. When discussing the psychological effects, it was informed that the mutilation is done with unhygienic tools like a scraper, stapler, blades, and others which ends up traumatizing the women for the rest of their lives. While Australia points out that women end up getting "vanigal infections" the united states emphasized how unbearable the procedure is. Throughout the session the integrity of many was questioned, one being the doctors of the world. The delegates partly blame the doctors for accepting the bribe to do such practices, but is it really the doctors who are at fault when the victims are ready for the victimization?

India believed that the practices are more prevalent in Muslim communities of the world and the illiterates play a major role in continuing the practice. The delegates firmly agreed that education plays a greater role in the spread of the mutilation and education should necessarily be provided to the citizens of the country but it does not assure the end of practice as The delegate of USA mentioned, "But there are many women who are educated and yet perform it and motivate the further generations to practice it." Which was backed by India with the example of the Bohra community, one of the supporters of female genital mutilation.

The two successful sessions ended with the forming of two blocs, the first led by the USA and Egypt while the other led by Pakistan and Kuwait.

Later the countries agreed to keep their fight aside and discuss about the solution.

On the other hand, while the other countries argued about the funding of the factory and, the delegate of Iraq remained “clueless” and took the the whole situation “leniently”. The delegate did not stand for herself and easily took the “allegations” put on her. The delegate seemed to have not cared about the harm it was causing to the world and mentioned “closing all the industries” and implement a “lockdown” without realising how many countries it would affect.
